



- ⊙ Alternative variety of winter wheat from France with high yield potential that has proven to be well adapted to the mild and wet Irish climate
- ⊙ Earliest maturing variety on the market which can spread workload and reduce risk, especially on larger farms
- ⊙ Very good resistance to Septoria (7), Yellow Rust (8) and Fusarium (7) which also reduces disease risk, and allows for more flexible spray timings and lower crop protection costs
- ⊙ Best as a first wheat, but demonstrates good resistance to Eyespot and can be drilled as second wheat if necessary
- ⊙ Wide sowing window - from mid-October to mid-February (ideal for later plantings after root crops)
- ⊙ Strong, stiff straw with very good resistance to sprouting (equal to or better than Costello) - important in difficult / wet harvest years
- ⊙ High specific weight, Hagberg and protein content - potentially suitable as a milling wheat
